


WHY STUDY AT BOSTON UNIVERSITY CELOP?

Intensive /

With 4-week, 6-week, and 12-week options, CELOP's Intensive programs are the perfect way to improve your English substantially in a short period of time.

Take skills courses at your individual language level in speaking and listening and reading and writing, and choose from elective courses in areas such as business communication, STEM, media news, Boston and American culture, and TOEFL preparation.

Part-Time /

CELOP offers a variety of part-time programs for students with a busy schedule.

There are 4-week, 6-week, and 12-week Part-Time programs that meet for 15 hours per week, as well as 12-week programs that meet for 5 or 10 hours per week.

In the 15 hour per week programs, you take skills courses at your individual language level in speaking and listening and reading and writing, and choose from elective courses in areas such as business communication, STEM, media news, Boston and American culture, and TOEFL preparation.

In the 5 and 10 hour per week programs, you can focus your studies on a content area that suits your interests and goals such as business communication, STEM, media news, Boston and American culture, or TOEFL preparation.

University Preparation /

If you already have an advanced level of English proficiency, CELOP offers several programs specifically focused on preparing you for university in the U.S.

During the Fall and Spring semesters, CELOP offers a unique English Plus Credit program that combines English skills classes with a Boston University academic class. In this program, you take skills courses at your individual language level in speaking and listening and reading and writing to improve your English alongside a credit-bearing class at BU's Metropolitan College. Earning university credits can strengthen your university applications and give you a jump start on your degree requirements.
