







- **STEPS FROM THE BEACH:** Walk from campus to La Jolla Shores, Black's Beach, or Torrey Pines State Beach.
- **ACCESS TO PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION:** The campus has easy access to the Blue Line of the San Diego Trolley and many bus links.
